

## FINDING A MENTOR AT APGSA

Mentoring at APGSA happens regularly on an informal basis. Members who would like an opinion on a topic, a dilemma, an idea, or a new project seek out other members who might be able to assist them. Sometimes members are seeking help; other times the same members might be offering help.

- under Contact Us.

Members are encouraged to take advantage of other members' generosity by making a contact when you would like to connect with another person who might have had experience with something with which you are now working. You might choose to ask someone because you know their expertise, have seen them present information, read their reply to a question, met them at a conference or meeting; if you would like help in finding someone to assist you, APGSA board members or executive director will try to suggest some who might be a good match for your need.
